



GROWTH

Methodist Children's Home continues to improve the infrastructure of the Waco campus through the Building Hope capital campaign. Additions are designed to provide state-of-the-art homes and facilities and position MCH to better care for youth today and in the future. Additionally, growth is seen through collaborations with like-minded organizations that further advance the MCH mission.

Chapel Improvements

The Harrell Memorial chapel received needed improvements to ensure the structure remains equipped as a spiritual gathering place for future generations.

The \$450,000 renovation included:

- New carpet and paint
- Refurbished stained-glass windows
- Restoration of original pews
- New sound system, cameras and projectors
- Addition of outdoor worship space and prayer labyrinth

One of the goals in our Strategic Plan is to increase investment of resources in collaborations with like-minded, transformative organizations. This fiscal year, MCH began intentional collaborations with ministries and community organizations across Texas and New Mexico to maximize the impact of MCH fiscally and professionally.




